AN ORDINANCE TO EXEMPT THE TOWN OF BEVIL OAKS
FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE VOLUNTEER
FIRE FIGHTERS' RELIEF AND RETIREMENT FUND
AS SET FORTH IN SENATE BILL NO. 411, PASSED
BY THE 65TH LEGISLATURE

* * * * *

WHEREAS, the 65th Legislature passed a bill creating a fire fighters' relief and retirement fund, and providing that the governing body of any political subdivision within which a rural fire commission district exists or any city or town within which a volunteer fire department is situated is subject to the provision of the Act; and

WHEREAS, under such Act unless a district or town voluntarily elects to exempt itself from the requirements before October 29, 1977, then each such governing body will be liable for a minimum of \$12 per month for each volunteer firefighter; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Bevil Oaks, Texas, are of the opinion that it would be to the best interest of the Town of Bevil Oaks, Texas, to exempt itself from such requirements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF BEVIL OAKS, TEXAS, AS FOLLOWS:

THAT the TOWN OF BEVIL OAKS, TEXAS, elects to exempt itself from the requirements of the Volunteer Fire Fighters' Relief and Retirement Fund as set forth in Senate Bill No. 411, passed by the 65th Legislature;

THAT an emergency exists due to the need to take such action in compliance with the law.

The foregoing ordinance was read and considered, and unanimously adopted by all of the Aldermen, as well as the Mayor, voting in favor thereof.
